



P-51B "CHAPPIE/DIXIE" MK X was assigned to Lt Richard L. "Dixie" Alexander of the 2 F.S., 52 F.G., and illustrates the earliest form of the Group's yellow markings. "Dixie" scored his initial victories in Spitfires while serving first in the 133 Eagle Squadron, and with the 2 FS., 52 F.G. He scored his final two victories in this Mustang, before being shot down by friendly fire from B-24s on May 30, 1944.



F-6C "Shovelnose & Handlebar", coded ZM'E was assigned to Lt. Edward J. Kenney of the 12 T.R.S., 10 P.R.G. during the last few months of the war. The art work and name is another of LLOYD HOOBERRY'S masterpieces and was added to the nose of his bird when it was learnt that Bob Hope and Jerry Cologne USO tour was coming to Furth airfield during June of 1945. The Vargas girl artwork under the canopy dates back to the time the aircraft was assigned to Lt. Robert Hansen.

P-51D "LITTLE EVA III", coded QP'E was assigned to Capt. James S. "Sully" Varnell, 2 F.S., 52 F.G. during the summer of 1944. Varnell, with 17 kills, was the 52 F.G. top ace. Sadly, after returning to trainig duties in the States at the end of his tour of duty, Varnell was killed in an accident when his P-40N suddenly dived into the sea.



F-6D "TAMPA JOE", coded ZM'F was assigned to Lt. Leo Elliott, 12 T.R.S., 10 P.R.G. The aircraft was named for a hometown friend of Elliott, and the art work was done by Lloyd Hooberry. Lt. Elliott flew this bird on the majority of his missions and claimed his total of 1.5 victories in it.
